School eco council : RSPB BIG GARDEN BIRD WATCH

This term the Etwall Primary School Eco Committee started the first of a number of school projects. They will be contributing to the annual RSPB Big Garden Bird Watch. They have spent one lunchtime watching through classroom windows, becoming more familiar with the bird species around school and recording their observations. The children

spotted many of the usual garden bird favourites, including Blackbirds, Robins, Blue Tits, Magpies and Coal Tits. Their findings will be shared with the children in school and the RSPB, helping both organisations to support the wildlife locally. The Eco Council also look forward to supporting **Switch Off Fortnight** in March.

GOVERNOR CORNER

The Governing Body still have 3 vacancies for Co-Opted Governors and we have advertised for these

KS1 Author Workshop

As part of our on-going work to improve our writing skills we had a special visitor come in to help us! Award winning author 'Billy Bob Buttons' visited the y1/2 children and gave them some top tips to make their writing more interesting and exciting! The children looked at character and setting descriptions and came up with their own descriptive phrases with the authors support and guidance. Billy Bob Buttons also read some of his favourite books to the children- which the children thought were hilarious! We are now putting these

top tips and hints to good use in our own writing lessons!

SAFEGUARDING: KEEPING SCHOOL UP-TO-DATE

Please could we remind parents of the importance of keeping the school up-to-date with key information as this has caused us some issues already this term in a range of circumstances:

- Please could we also remind you that **you are not allowed to take any child, other than your own**, without their parent notifying school directly of this arrangement.
- If you see that a KS2 child has not been met by their adult as they normally are, please tell them that they **MUST come back into school to their class teacher** who will care for them











whilst their parent(s) are contacted. The children are reminded of this on a regular basis but sometimes they feel they should give their adult a few more minutes. Thank you for safeguarding all the children.

- Reminder –please do not exit the school building in the mornings via the Y3/4 door as this is kept locked. Thank you.
- Reminder please do not exit via the main entrance doors in the morning. Please do not open these doors for children as they MUST be signed in by office staff when they are late after 8.55am
- All staff have just received further training on positive behaviour support including physical interventions. The model DCC policy is now being reviewed in school and will be put on the school web site when agreed and adopted by all staff and governors.
- **ROBINS AND WOODPECKERS** please do not forget that the children will be dismissed from their classroom (rear doors) from Monday 30th January.
- Online Safety : Etwall Primary School continues to empower our children to keep themselves safe online. This term, we will be holding our annual Online Safety Week (Monday 6th Friday 10th February). During this week, we will be continuing to train and educate children around all aspects of Online Safety. Traci Good, an e-safety advisor, will be running workshops for all classes on Thursday 9th February and then running a workshop for parents/carers after school (3:45pm-4:45pm). A letter containing all of the necessary information will be handed out separately on Monday. Please attend the issues that children are having to potentially face online are *HUGE* and are vastly under estimated and understood by parents/carers. We did not grow up with the enormous range of technology and means of social communication that the children are now facing. *Come and find out how you can keep your child safe.* If you have any queries regarding this, please do not hesitate to speak to Miss Marriott.

SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT 2016-17:

Homework :

Following consultation with staff, children and parents, the homework policy was changed and a letter sent out to parents outlining our expectations for your child's homework. All children are expected to read at least five times each week at home, to learning their multiplication / division

facts, practice their Rapid Number Recall target and also to learn their spellings / practice phonics. Details of all this was sent home to each parent via the homework book or reading diary. Please speak to your child's class teacher should you need to discuss any aspect of this. The letter can be found on the school web site if you have mislaid your copy.

A voluntary **homework project** was also detailed for each key stage and we look forward to seeing this in school later this term. **The new Homework Showcase is on Wednesday February 8th from 2.45pm for KS2 and Monday 6th February from 2.45pm in the school**

hall. Homework projects are due in to class teachers by Friday 3rd February – we are really looking forward to seeing them!

RAPID NUMBER RECALL – Note from Miss Gale.

PRIDE

As you will be aware, your child spends the first few minutes of the afternoon each day practicing their rapid number recall target, and doing a mini 'test'. If your child gets all of the questions right on three separate occasions they will be moved up a

step. When your child has done this, the new target is stuck in their reading diary so you can help them with it at home. With this step there are ideas of how this can be practised and what the target means. Thank you as always for your support.

Behaviour Policy:

The school has reviewed its behaviour policy with staff and parents and is currently awaiting feedback from the children via the school council. This policy will be uploaded to the school web site when the review is complete – you will be alerted to this via text. Thank you for the feedback we received. It was all very constructive and really focused on improving school practice.

SCHOOL COUNCIL AND MISSION STATEMENT UPDATE

The school council are currently working with classes to find out what they think of the revised behaviour policy and are also searching for a <u>new school motto!</u> Staff and governors have been working on a revised school vision and mission statement which will be ready soon. We have worked hard to ensure we capture the ethos and vision for

DINNER MONEY POLICY

Please could we remind you that the Dinner Money Policy is on the school web site. The school office would like to remind you of the payments required for lunches within this policy:

- Please put payments in a sealed envelope child's name, class and amount on the front.
- Please **do not** hand in at the school office but send via your child's class teacher on Mondays.







- The school office will contact parents should unpaid meals be ordered requesting payment. This will be by telephone or text. Please settle this payment immediately.
- If dinner money debts are not settled in a timely manner, the school will formally write to you and **will expect you to provide packed lunches from home** until the debt is settled.
- Debt limits are £10 per child or £20 per family. The school cannot allow a debt to exceed these limits.
 - Please speak to Miss Dixey or Mrs East if you are experiencing problems as you may be entitled to free school meals and the school can help check for you.

Please do not be offended if you are asked to provide your child with a packed lunch – this is to help you as we do not wish the dinner money debt to increase. Thank you for your continued support.

HOLOCAUSE MEMORIAL DAY JANUARY 27TH 2017

Today is a day for everyone to remember the millions of people who were killed, or whose lives have been changed, by an event in history called the Holocaust and we are reminded of what can happen when prejudice and persecution are left unchallenged. The reason it is held on 27 January is because this was the day in 1945 that the soldiers fighting against the Germans took over the largest Nazi concentration camp called Auschwitz-Birkenau and freed the prisoners there who were still alive.

Holocaust Memorial Day is a day to remember how important it is not to spread messages of hate, or to exclude people because of things like the colour of their skin or what religious beliefs they have. Sadly, the Holocaust is not the only genocide that has ever happened.

On 27 January, we also remember the millions of people who have been killed or affected by other genocides in the world, in places like Cambodia, Rwanda, Bosnia and Darfur.

All staff and children attended an assembly given by Mrs Toynbee this afternoon and participated in an activity in class to reflect on this day (age appropriate).
