English, Maths and Science

English - In English lessons this half term we will basing 3 weeks worth of work on some 'Space Themed' texts

to help get us warmed up for our topics! In addition to this we will



also be spending 2 weeks reading and creating poems based on a theme! We also spend lots of time improving our SPAG skills (spelling, punctuation and Grammar)

Maths-Children will be learning lots of new skills, strategies and methods in maths this half term. These include, number & place value, measurement (time), multiplication and Division, fractions, and statistics. As you will agree, there is lots to cover! If you are unsure which methods we use to teach any of these topics then please do not hesitate to talk to your child's class teacher to ensure we are all using the same techniques!

Science- Working well aside our topic (Neil Armstrong) we will be posing the question:

What would Buzz Lightyear see if he was flying up into space? Children will be learning about various aspects of Space including planet names, understanding how the sun gives us light during the day, but not at night and also why we can only see the stars at night time. We will also be visiting the National Space Centre! Very exciting!

Music, DT, R.E, P.E and PSHE

Music- This terms focus is 'Duration' children will be playing a mixture of instruments to compose pieces of music that differ in duration.

DT- Linking with our science topic we will be designing and creating our own Moon Buggies by using Mechanisms, wheels and axis

RE- Children will be exploring; In what ways is a church important to believers?

P.E- Children will be practising their balance, agility and coordination skills during P.E lessons. They will be exploring various

ways of travelling across various equipment.

PSHE- Children will be learning about staying fit and healthy and undergoing some astronaut training! We will also be thinking about medicines and how they help to keep us healthy!

Computing

This half-term we will be inputting text, pictures and sound clips into PowerPoint to cre-

ate our own interactive presentations all about space! We will be doing lots of research first and planning out what will be going on each slide.

If you are a parent/carer who can spare even an hour each week, you are very welcome to come in and be an extra pair of hands. We are also very appreciative of any helpers that can support us on class trips during the year. Please let your child's class teacher know if you would like to help at any point during the term. This could be to help in the classroom, help with displays or hear readers. Let us know what you would prefer to do!

Resources for home!

Every child at Etwall Primary school has access details to a number of different educational sites. Your child will have login details for 'Bug Club' (reading), 'Purple Mash' (all topics), and 'Interactive Resources' (maths). These are resources that the school pays for, so please make the most of them!



Anti-bullying Week 13th—17th November

Etwall Primary School will be taking part in National Anti-Bullying week between 13th-17th November. Mrs Millward will be running drama based workshops for the whole school during this week. Children will be learning about various types of bullying and being made aware of what is and isn't classed as bullying. In addition to this all classes will be doing lots of anti-bullying themed work in their normal lesson time.

During this time you can read books or even complete some 'blue pen work' in your child's exercise books. 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KS1 Space Centre Trip!

The countdown is officially on for our KS1 trip to the National Space Centre and we are all very excited! Here are a few reminders in preparation for the day:

- Children are to wear normal school uniform.
- Please bring a packed lunch in a <u>named</u> bag, including water bottle (Lunch bags will be stored in a large container during our visit and so children will need to be able to identify which lunch bag is theirs!)
