#### **IMAGINEERING CLUB**

The Imagineers have been busy this term, making a variety of complex models and engineering feats.

These included a car powered by a deflating balloon, which had its complications. The main issue was making sure the wheel nuts weren't too tight, or the wheels would just not go around! We raced them in the corridor, and most of them were speedy and impressive.

We created aeroplanes which used the potential energy stored in a tightly wound elastic band, to turn the propeller. The height which the aeroplanes reached varied, depending on the accuracy of the building of the plane itself. Many of them reached the very high ceilings in Kestrels' classroom! Well

done!

Another item made was a micrometre, which the children not only had to build, but also had to calibrate. Most children's micrometres were fairly accurate, but it highlighted the challenge that Rolls Royce engineers face – how do we know we are measuring accurately? Our thanks go out to Mrs Hendriksen, Mrs Silvester and other RR engineers who have made this club possible for many years now. They do an amazing job! #### NATIONAL AUTISM AWARENESS WEEK (APRIL)

<u>Week 23<sup>rd</sup> April – 27<sup>th</sup> April</u> : During this week, we are looking to further raise children's awareness of Autism Spectrum Disorders, gain understanding, inclusion and acceptance.



We feel that is important for the children to understand that we are all individuals and realise that somebody with Autism will understand the world in a different way. To help raise awareness, we are going to be spending some time during this week looking at Autism and how it affects how a person thinks, feels and learns. The children will be watching videos and doing some fun games and activities to help them understand what being Autistic may be like and that it is "okay to be different."

During this week, one of the activities is a **competition** by Teaching

Personnel to help engage children in a conversation about Autism and how to be better friends to



children with Autism. This competition will be completed in school and children will draw a scene which depicts 'something that makes you happy' - the deadline for all entries will be 27th April 2018 and the winners will be announced shortly after. ## **KS1 OPEN FAITH CENTRE ENRICHMENT VISIT**

What a fantastic day KS1 had at The Open Faith Centre. It is certainly the highlight of the year to be able to visit the centre and surrounding area where the children can become immersed in cultures and traditions that are different to their own and yet experience so much that is similar to their own daily lives. Thank you to all parents/carers that supported this enriching experience. The day focused, in particular, on some of our STARFISH values: Respect, Friendship, Truthfulness which are so important in today's society where we value *Tolerance* highly. We are looking forward to the KS2 visits later in the summer term.

> KS1 started the day learning about Arabic. The children were

able to write their own names in Arabic and were encouraged to remember to write from right to left. To help the children remember the Arabic alphabet they played snap games with all the Arabic letters and wrote them in sand for their partners to guess. They learnt about how Muslim children learn the Arabic alphabet and often attend Arabic

lessons after school.

To understand more about the Islamic faith the children visited a Mosque. It was very beautiful inside and out with Arabic writing around the walls, domes on the roof and a huge red carpet. Once we were inside, they removed their shoes and cover their heads as a sign of respect. The children then visited a prayer room and learnt lots about the Mosque. They learnt that all the carpets faced towards Mecca and that the final prophet sent by Allah was













Muhammad (peace be upon him). It was very interesting find out about how Muslim's worship.

After lunch, the children were able to walk around Normanton. There are many religious buildings around the area churches, Hindu temples and the Mosque, which they looked out for and learnt about them as we walked around the area. They also noticed Arabic writing in some of the shop windows, which meant that Halal meat is sold there. The whole key stage had a great time on the trip and have learnt many new things about Islam, Arabic and the Mosque. A big thank you to all the adults that were able to help on the visit.



## EYFS NEWS

This half term we have been learning about people who help us. We have had lots of visitors many of them parents come into school and talk to the children about how they help people in their job.

The children have met a postman, physiotherapist, paramedics, a bank manager, a fire crew and dental nurse. We have enjoyed finding out about

what people wear, do and travel in. They have seen how to use crutches, clean teeth, been inside an ambulance, save money, post letters and spray water using a fire hose.

#### KS2 INFERENCE WORKSHOP

#### SCHOOL SPORT / FUNDING ROUND-UP

It's been a busy time for sports since Christmas, with children participating in a wide variety of events. The Year 5/6 football team put up a good defence of our EFL Kids Cup title and were unlucky not to qualify for the next phase of the competition. We have also had teams taking part in the Year 5 and 6 basketball finals, Year 5 and 6 goalball (a kind of blindfolded handball), EYFS and Year 1 Early Racers (racing on balance bikes), all of whom represented the school in an exceptional manner.





Further to this, we have also sent teams to an indoor athletics tournament - where Year 3 and 4 finished runners up, the indoor cricket finals - where the Year 5 and 6 team finished runners up - the A League football finals where the Year 5 and 6 team was knocked out in the semi-finals on penalties and the South Derbyshire swimming gala, which we won - retaining our title from last year!

## SCHOOL PREMISES ROUND UP

The school has recently upgraded lighting in Woodpecker classroom and it is amazing! Please pop and have a look. It has been long awaited so we thank the EYFS team for their patience.

Derbyshire County Council have now appointed an architect to plan the schools two new classrooms. This is due to the extensive housing developments in the local area for which DCC is given Section 106 funding by the builders which is in turn used to build additional schools/classrooms as needed. Etwall Primary have been allocated 2 new classrooms and also the promises that the staff room building and the Vic Hallam building, that houses Eagle class, will be refurbished. School Governors have received the first draft of the plans and school staff and governors will be providing feedback to the Local Authority this week. It is highly likely that they will be built onto the library/school carpark area of the school so as to not take away green areas within the school grounds. It is anticipated that these will be built in the next 2 years, with the Pupil admission Numbers (PAN) rising to 45 from 40 at the same time.



<u>Swimming Pool Update</u> ...... As everyone is aware, our swimming pool has been out of action for several weeks now. This is regrettable, but has been completely out of our hands due to the nature of the repairs needed. The magnitude of the work that is required has necessitated getting in specialist contractors to quote for the work that is required (this has not been an easy task) and we are looking at repair costs of up to

potentially £16,000 - this includes a new liner, filtration, steps, heating repairs and surround for the pool. The amount of money needed to get it back in service is not an inconsiderable sum, as you can well imagine, and we are waiting on funding streams (DCC IMP funding and Awards for All lottery funding) through a couple of channels to help us with these costs. We are also very grateful to the Etwall Parish Council who have generously donated £1000 towards this project via the PTFA. We thank Mrs Goodchild and Mrs Madden for all their hard work on behalf of the school.

If you know at the start of a day about a change to collection arrangements, you only need speak to your child's class teacher in the morning – you do not have to call the office.
