Dear Parents / Carers,

Busy term! Here is some of the news and events from the last few weeks. We break up for half term holidays on Friday 26th May, with an INSET day straight afterwards on Monday 5th June 2017. Children will not in school on Monday 5th June but we will see you at the normal time on Tuesday 6th June. Enjoy the break!

We are officially a Sun Safe School!



We are all very excited to have been awarded the 'Sun Safe Schools' award. The children must still remember to be 'sun safe aware' by following the 5 S's rule! **SLIP, SLOP, SLAP, SLIDE, SHADE!**

This means: SLIP on a t-shirt, SLOP on some sun-cream, SLAP on a hat, SLIDE on some sunglasses and find some SHADE!

For the past two years a sun hat has been part of the school uniform between Easter and October. This is vital for the children to be protected

against harmful UV rays. Please avoid base ball type hats as they do not provide sufficient protection – research has shown that a full brim will do this best. *Please ensure that your child has a sun hat in school every day in order for them to go outside.* We also ask them to apply sun cream <u>before</u> they come to school and then reapply using our sun-cream dispensers, which are dotted around the school. Please do a test on your child's skin if you haven't done so already. Please fill a form in at the school office if your child cannot use this cream. Thank you for your continued support in protecting the children.

SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT WORK : BEHAVIOUR POLICY STARFISH VALUES

As a school, we have launched Starfish values through the work that we have done on the school Behaviour Policy. We told you about this in a recent newsletter and I am sure you will have seen the new posters around school. Children are encouraged to demonstrate sportsmanship, truthfulness, aspiration, respect, friendship, independence, sharing and helpfulness in all aspects of their life and we focus on these in school as part of our daily school life. Children are rewarded for demonstrating these values by:

- receiving certificates in our reward assembly
- working together to earn STARFISH time for the class at the end of the week
- and earning STARFISH points for their house for which the winning team receives a weekly trophy.

The children are really on board with the new system and we are pleased with the way they have all responded. As part of this work, the school is updating the school mission statement and aims, alongside the starfish values. The children have been suggesting new school mottos, which are being looked at over the next few weeks. This will be launched ready for the new school year. Exciting!

SCHOOL FUNDING IN CRISIS ACROSS THE COUNTRY

You will have heard a lot in the news over the last few months about funding in education and the issues that many schools across the country are facing. We, like all schools, have had to "tighten our belts" for the new financial year, which began on April 1st 2017 and draw on our reserve to ensure that governors can balance the



budget this year. Derbyshire County Council are used to managing a poor budget as historically, school funding has not been fairly distributed across the country. The situation will get worse for all schools and we would like to make you aware of a few facts.

- Each primary school will lose £403 per pupil by 2020, with 99% of schools being affected. This amounts to £3 billion by 2020 (analysis of DfE data).
- Schools will have to pay increased national insurance and pension costs of over 5% for all staff.
- The Education Services Grant to Local Authorities is being abolished with a loss to education of £600 million.
- National Apprentice levy has been introduced which is a new cost to all schools.
- As a result, all schools will have a real term increase of 8% in the running costs of the school. This is based on data from the National Audit office.
- 18% of schools have already reached a deficit budget ie they do not have sufficient funding to run their schools without making severe cuts and these are usually to equipment, staff training and Teaching Assistants.
- It is predicted that by 2018 68% of school budgets will be unsustainable and this is predicted to reach 78% by 2020.
- The National Funding Formula is designed to make things fairer for all schools this is a good thing and school applaud this. BUT...the problem is that the pot of money is not big enough to sustain school budgets and this is the issue that is worrying every school. All schools are losing in real terms and there are no winners.

There is more information and figures for the country on <u>www.schoolcuts.org.uk</u>. Obviously, there are different political views on education spending, but we aim just to provide the facts as they are.

At Etwall, we are having to use our reserve and have also explored with staff and Governors, how we could make savings in order to balance our budget this year. More savings will be needed next year. To give you an idea of what the school expenditure covers :

- A large part is allocated to staff costs teachers, teaching assistants, cleaning contracts, supply teacher costs, Midday Supervisors, school office, catering staff. We have had to reduce <u>additional</u> teaching assistant hours that provide <u>extra support</u> through interventions. We are currently looking at the needs of the children and will have to provide ALL extra support within TA contracted hours only. This does not affect the hours that TA's currently spend in class each morning, but two TA's will continue on temporary contracts for 2017-18. Other local schools have had to make TA redundancies. Governors have elected to continue paying the Living wage for this financial year, but the decision is taken annually. For the year, we have managed to make savings in other areas also.
- The school also has costs relating to gas, electricity, rent, grounds and school alarm maintenance, hardware maintenance, telephone, broadband link, security, water rates, which are substantial. *These are all essential services and it is hard to make huge savings in this area.*
- Part of the schools income are ring fenced for sport, English as an additional language (EAL) and pupil premium children. *This part of the budget cannot be used for anything else and the school works with the LA to get best value.*
- School has to allocate £6000 for each child who needs extra SEND support in order to meet their additional needs. Extra funding can be accessed through an Education Health Care Plan (EHCP) used to be called a Statement of Educational Needs. *We are reviewing how we allocate this funding and how we can use existing staff to address these needs.*
- Devolved Formula Capital (DFC) funding is only used to help the school fund IT provision eg laptops and ipads as well as premises





work eg new lighting, refurbishment of classrooms etc. This is usually around £7/8,000 a year. *This part of the budget cannot be used for anything else.*

- Other parts of the school budget are allocated to staff training (CPD), subscriptions eg Bug Club, First News, software, Non IT learning resources eg books, exercise books, pencils etc, art and craft resources, topic resources, cleaning and caretaking equipment, furniture, photocopying costs, premises improvements and printing and stationary. We have shaved these budgets in order to make savings and are looking at further ways to make even more savings eg providing all children with a "toolkit" that they have to look after (pencil, ruler etc) and will be looking to parents/carers to support the school as we cannot continue to replace lost/damaged items. All these budgets have been reduced to a bare minimum.
- We have been very pleased with the year on year increase in parents /carers who have opted for email communication. This saves the school a huge photocopying bill, but we are looking to reduce this even further. We currently provide hard copies for non email families and put all letters on the school web site. If your child loses a letter, please refer to the school web site as the school office will no longer be providing an additional copy as this is a further cost to the school.
- From September, we will strive to become a paperless school and we look to parents/carers to support this. We would like more parents/carers to opt for the email system. This can be done via the school office.
- From September, all parents/carers will complete ONE parental consent form for visits saving time, effort and cost. This can be updated if any changes occur at the school office as needed.

We are committed to continuing to support the children, staff and parents of EPS and will continue to keep you informed of the difficult decisions that we will have to make moving forward.

children will have the opportunity to have a morning in reception, a chance to taste one of our wonderful school meal and then have a taster swimming lesson. It is an exciting time for all.

SAFEGUARD UPDATE:

e-schools

The school has reviewed its use of the e-schools platform. E-schools hosts the school web site and this enables the school to use its wider online facilities. We are now looking at changing provider over the coming year to make use of the e-schools bulk emailing to parents, parents evening online booking and texts to parents etc. We have looked at online epayer for parents but the transaction costs incurred are too great for the school and at a time when we are having to make saving, it would not be viable for the school. We have made a decision not to use the children's learning platform as it

is not adding anything to the quality of the curriculum the children receive. Class areas on the web site will now include suggestions of any enrichment activity the children could do outside of school in topic areas, so please visit these areas regularly with your children.



Safeguard Training – Neglect

Miss Dixey (Head and Designated safeguarding Lead) and Mrs Toynbee (Deputy Designated safeguarding Lead) will be attending training in June around neglect of children as part of the schools ongoing training and commitment to safeguarding all children.

"Neglect is the ongoing failure to meet a child's basic needs and is the most common form of child abuse. A child may be left hungry or dirty, without adequate clothing, shelter, supervision, medical or health care. A child may be put in danger or not protected from physical or emotional harm. They may not get the love, care and attention they need from their parents." (NSPCC)



Cruelty to children must stop. FULL STOP.

Training this year has included an update to PREVENT agenda, online safety and more recently safeguarding children under private fostering arrangements. This year we have also ensured that all our school volunteers have

undergone a safeguarding training session with Mr Ormiston – we are very pleased with the response to this.

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ONLINE SAFETY

Etwall Primary School continues to empower our children to keep themselves safe online. Please remember to talk to your child regularly about online safety as it continues to remain prevalent in the news.

Fact:

<u>Children aged from three to four years old spend 6.5 hours per week on the internet. Five to seven</u> year olds spend 9.2 hours a week there, eight to eleven year olds spend seventeen hours per week on the internet. The more time spent using the internet, the more chance there is that they will encounter a predator that is looking to exploit them.

HOW DO WE SUPPORT CHILDTEN WITH AUTISM AT ETWALL PRIMARY SCHOOL?

The school have used the National Autism Standards to make autism a focus for development over the last three years. Sensory audits have been completed and intervention groups have been set up to support the children with their social communication and

understanding. This year, an autism voice group has been created, which has been used to gather the views of children with autism at our school. The children have fed back information about the school building, their classroom, break times and school staff. They have had some very good ideas and as a result there will be changes made to these areas based on their needs. Mrs Jenner, SEND Governor, works closely with Mrs Giles, SENCo, to support this work across the school and reports her findings to the Governing Body.



DEMOCRACY DAY AND THE SCHOOL'S GENERAL ELECTION

As part of the schools continued work on British Values, we will having a Democracy Day to raise the



children's awareness of the electoral process in Great Britain. We will be looking at main political parties and trying to summarise their views about the key issues and encourage them to think about what they would want the new government to do! The children will "mount" a campaign for the day, designing posters and write campaign speeches to help them be elected!
