Dear Parents / Carers,

What a busy term! Don't forget to keep looking on the school web site – class pages – for up to date news about your child's class and what learning is taking place. The school calendar is also full of dates for the year.

**School Funding** continues to be in the news and is a burning issues for all schools whilst the National Funding Formula (NFF) is fully implemented by the government. We have previously outlined the cuts that we have had to make to ensure that we are only spending the budget we receive. Derbyshire schools have historically been underfunded, so the NFF will put us more in line with schools in other parts of the country.



However, although government funding is going to be more fairly distributed across all schools, it still remains an issue that the total education funding to ALL is not sufficient to meet the needs of schools. This is an issue that teaching unions, schools and parents continue to lobby the government about as a total of £2 billion extra funding needs to be given to schools to combat the 8% reduction in real terms that school budgets have suffered in recent

years. If you feel this is something that you would like to write to your local MP about, then please do so. Thank you for your support.

**Etwall Primary School** has received very kind offers of support from many parents who wish to "do a bit more" for the school. This is very much appreciated! One of the ways that parents could support the school is by lobbying their MP for better funding for all schools as above. Governors and school leadership have also discussed other ways in which parents could support the school. The school have approached the **PTFA** to fund two more new Interactive boards for our classrooms. These cost £2000 each including fitting – we currently have new boards in Sparrow Hawks and Robins and a new one is due to be fitted before Christmas in Kestrels class. These are exceptional pieces of kit and work without a projector which is cost saving in the long term. The school is also looking to replenish the reading bands with more variety and boy friendly books. These would be funded through the PTFA events and parent donations.

The school is also looking to set up an **Amazon wish list** – details of this will be published in the New Year. It is anticipated that staff and children will list items that they would like to enrich their learning or items for wet play activity etc and parents can then choose to purchase the item for the school or contribute towards an item. Mrs Gabbitas will publicise this after Christmas.



These are two ways of donating to the school for items that the school would really appreciate – please continue to support PTFA events and consider the Amazon Wish List when it is publicised. *Your support is greatly appreciated as always.*

PUPIL PREMIUM FUNDING

This is another way in which parents can support their child's learning – please read carefully and consider whether you are eligible to apply for this funding. Some parents think that applying for this funding when their KS1 child already receives free school meals is pointless, but we would urge all parents to speak to the school office or Mr Ormiston if you are in receipt of any of the listed benefits as you may

be entitled to receive this funding to support your *child's learning* plus receive the extra benefits detailed below. This funding is calculated from our census return on 18<sup>th</sup> January 2018 so it is vital that you contact us immediately so you can apply for it.

As you can see, the bulk of our funding goes to provide specific support for Pupil Premium children through teaching assistants and dedicated intervention staff and, as such, is a key source of funding for the school.

# **Reduction in funding this year**

Due to a number of children eligible for Pupil Premium leaving in Summer 2017, our funding has since dropped, which has had a knock on effect on what we can offer children. We have taken the difficult decision to maintain what we provide for intervention and support (as this is key to helping the children progress), leading to a drop in what we can offer to support enrichment and well-being activities, although recognising the importance of supporting the whole child.

#### How can I help?

Parents often see the Pupil Premium funding as just 'Free School Meals' when, as we have shown, the reality is much more than that. By signing up for Pupil Premium funding, you will have a direct impact on improving the education of both your child and those across the school for the next <u>6</u> <u>years</u>.

# What does my child receive?

Your child will receive:

- Additional daily support from a Teaching Assistant in morning lessons.
- Personalised support in one-to-one or small group sessions for your child, whatever their academic ability, provided by a dedicated Pupil Premium teacher
- Specific 'pre-learning' sessions from class teachers as appropriate
- Access to a Pupil Premium Champion who will support their learning and talk to them about what they need
- 50% funded enrichment day visits
- 50% discounted wrap around care (breakfast and after school club)



- 50% funded extra-curricular activities such as sports, Imagineering and language clubs one per term
- Music lessons should they wish to learn how to play a musical instrument (partially funded £1.50 per session)
- Subsidies for residential visits
- Provision of free books relating to the interests of each child up to £20 per year
- £25 contribution towards school uniform costs
- Free nutritious school meals on a daily basis which continue for 6 years

# Is my child eligible?

Your child is eligible for Pupil Premium funding if you receive any of the following:

- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less
- Universal credit

# Your child is also eligible if:

- Defined in the Children Act 1989 as one who is in the care of, or provided with accommodation by, an English local authority
- Children who have ceased to be looked after by a local authority in England and Wales because of adoption, a special guardianship order, a child arrangements order or a residence order
- Has a parent who is in the armed forces

# How Do I Apply?

If you think you may be eligible for Pupil Premium funding, please contact the school office immediately so we can process your application **before January 18<sup>th</sup> 2018**. We will happily discuss this with you and even fill the forms in on your behalf.

# SCHOOL SPORT ROUND-UP

School sport continues on apace and this term has seen us participate in a number of different competitions: the Year 5/6 girls entered a football competition in October at The Pingle Academy, narrowly missing out on making the knockout stages; the 'A' league football has concluded, with one of the teams making the finals. We took two teams to the dodgeball competition in early November, where they represented the school in an excellent manner, whilst the basketball team has qualified for the South Derbyshire Finals; narrowly losing just the one match in the process. We took 6 teams to the gymnastics competition at Greenbank Leisure Centre in Swadlincote, representing all year groups from Year 1 to Year 6, with the Year 5 and 6 team finishing in second place.

There are lots more competitions on the way, so watch this space for more details. As well as all this, we sent 4 children to a Gifted and Talented football day, provided by South Derbyshire ASP and have







a inter-school sports competition running for the whole of Key Stage 2. If it is successful, we may well roll it out for Key Stage 1 in the Summer term.

On the awards front, the football team that did so well at Wembley in May, came runners up in the recent Derby Telegraph Sports awards.

Don't forget that we offer free, voluntary lunchtime sporting opportunities for all age groups and also sessions specifically targeted at getting girls more interested in sport.



#### SAFEGUARDING: Online Safety

Online Safety continues to be of paramount importance at Etwall Primary School. Year 5/6 Digital Leaders are currently being trained as peer mentors to offer support and advice to their fellow pupils regarding staying safe when online.

#### **Online Safety Week**

Safer Internet Day (SID) 2018 will be celebrated globally on Tuesday 6th February 2018 with the slogan "Create, Connect and Share Respect: A better internet starts with you". We will be holding our annual Online Safety week to coincide with SID. The children will be participating in various Online Safety activities.

There will be an NSPCC Online Safety workshop for parents on Wednesday 17th January 2018 2pm – 3pm. Please show your support by attending this extremely important and informative event. #### SCHOOL LUNCH

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Thank you to everyone who regularly pays for their child's dinners in advance and on time – this really helps with our admin processes. Please remember that dinners should always be paid for in advance, ideally on a Monday each week (or the first day back after a closure day). We return to school for the start of Spring T3 Term on Wednesday 3 January - dinners for this week will be £6.00. If any parent wishes to pay for the half term up to 15 February (Friday 16 February is an INSET closure day), the cost will be £64 (32 days); For the full term up to Easter, the cost would be £104 (52 days). If you pay in advance, if your child were absent for any reason, the dinner is carried forward and not lost. Cash or cheque payable to *DCC* are acceptable methods of payment. We cannot accept loose change over the counter in the admin office and do not give change.* 



SCHOOL ADMISSIONS for Sept 2018 (Reception chn): If you have a child born between 01.09.2013 and 31.08.2014, just a quick reminder that you need to apply for your child's Reception school place by **15**<sup>th</sup> January 2018 with Derbyshire County Council.

**EXITING SCHOOL BUILDING**: Polite reminder that the front entrance doors should <u>only</u> be used if you need to speak to the Admin staff in the school office. *Please do* not use this as an exit door in the mornings – KS1 use class external doors, KS2 use exits by Osprey class please.





**END OF DAY ARRANGEMENTS:** If you are changing your child's end of school collection arrangements *as a one off,* please remember to tell your child's class teacher/TA in the morning. The school office receive many messages throughout the day about collection arrangements and it would really help if this were sorted in the morning with the teacher and not via the school office. However, we do understand that sometimes circumstances change during the day and a message has



to come through. Any permanent changes, please make the changes on the Home time Arrangements form at the school office. A copy is then updated in class. Thank you

**COMMUNICATION:** We have many comments about the amount of letters and messages coming home. We always endeavour to keep parents and carers as well informed as we possibly can and the easiest way of getting messages across for us is via text and email; this is also the most cost effective way of communication for school. Letters are always uploaded onto the website – if you think you have missed one this is a good place to check! Remember that letters do not necessarily need to be printed off for the reply slip – a hand written note with the requested information is often sufficient to be returned to school. We are in the process of moving the email system to e-schools, so please ensure that you keep the office up to date with email addresses. Thank you.

**SCHOOL UNIFORM REMINDER:** It is school policy that children do not wear nail polish to school. Please make sure nail polish on children is removed prior to coming to school. It is school policy that the children remove nail varnish in school following an initial warning. Also, wherever possible no earrings should be worn by children. We will accept small studs but these must be taken out for PE or swimming – and children must be able to remove these themselves. Etwall Primary School accept no responsibility for jewellery items that children bring to school – these are all sent in at parents & carers' own risk. *Please refer to the school prospectus on the school web site for full details.*

#### MINDFULNESS ATTENTION PROGRAMME Y56 CHILDREN

Our Year 5/6 children were chosen to take part in an exciting new project, which aimed to introduce children to mindfulness. Mindfulness involves paying more attention to what is happening right now, with an attitude of curiosity and kindness. By teaching our children to focus a little more on what is happening now



and how we are feeling, they can learn to manage day to day difficulties and enjoy themselves more. Children were taught by their own class teacher, who was trained to deliver the programme. The programme consisted of nine sessions that were fun and designed to support children in developing skills that enable them to pay attention more effectively, cope with day-to-day stresses and get on better with each other. The children have completed the programme; the response received from the children has been positive and children are beginning to see the benefits.



The Spread Eagle will be running a competition throughout December. Entry cost is  $\pm 3$  with the winner will be picked at random on New Year's Eve. All profits are being donated to the school so why not pop in and have a go!

# SPEAK OUT STAY SAFE NSPCC WORKSHOP

The NSPCC recently came into school and delivered an assembly to KS1 and then KS2 all about how children can stay safe. The different types of abuse were described to the children as appropriate for the age group, and what they could do if they needed some help. In Y56 classes, the follow-up activities were all about things that are right or wrong; there were opportunities for children to discuss statements and share their thoughts and opinions. Children were given Stay Safe Kits and they were asked to keep them safe, in case they ever need them. The key message the children learned was that it is important to Speak Out and Stay Safe. They

also all learned the Childline number, as this is a number where they can speak to someone about something that they are worried about. This is part of the schools ongoing safeguarding work with the children.



#### PETER PAN DERBY THEATRE VISIT

On Thursday 7th December KS2 children enjoyed a super visit to Derby Theatre to watch Peter Pan, to celebrate the literature of a classical author. The children thoroughly enjoyed their visit, the cast and


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on all the basics that your child needs to learn – this will support their learning across the curriculum. Thank you!
