Welcome back! We hope you have had a lovely half term break and are rested and ready for the busy term ahead.

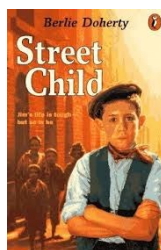
Maths and English

Remember:

- * PE kits need to be in school every day.
- * Reading journals will be checked every Tuesday.
- * Spelling test is every Tuesday. Please support your child in learning their spellings.
- * Children will have mental maths and writing targets glued into their reading journals. Times tables are also expected to be practised every week.

English

In English this term we will be studying a narrative unit, reading and writing fantasy texts. We will also be studying poems with imagery and information texts. We will be reading the novel *Street Child* by Berlie Doherty, to help us to understand what life was like for some children during the Victorian era. Through



our work with this text and through our guided reading lessons we will continue to work on our inference and deduction skills. As part of our English work we will continue to develop our knowledge of spellings, punctuation and grammar (SPAG).

Maths

In maths this term we will be looking at fractions and statistics. We will continue to work

on formal methods for addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.

Although we will be practising our multiplication facts in school, the quicker the children can recall these facts, the easier they will find the whole maths curriculum. Please encourage your child to practise these at home.

Our topic this term will be 'How did the Victorian period help shape the Etwall we know today?' As part of our work on this topic, we will be learning about what life was like during the Victorian era.

In science our topic is sound. We will look closely at why pop music is so enjoyable. In PE our theme is balance and we will be doing some floor work. In RE our topic is 'What makes a leader worth following?' In Citizen-

ship our theme is relationships and in computing we will be programming, coding and controlling devices. In German our theme is days leisure and entertainment and in music we will be learning some carols for the Christmas Carol Concert at St. Helen's

Useful English vocabulary

Children in year 4 are expected to have a sound knowledge of the different words classes in the English language. To help your child to develop their knowledge of this, the following vocabulary may be useful:

Common nouns—names of objects or things in general, e.g.

dog, school.

Proper nouns—names of people or places, e.g. Etwall, Harry.

Verbs—doing words.

Adjectives—describing words.

Pronouns—replace a noun, e.g. him/her /it.

Adverbs—describe a verb or an

adjective, e.g. slowly, lazily.

Preposition—describes the position of something, e.g. on/under.

Conjunction—a connecting word such as and, because, so, consequently.

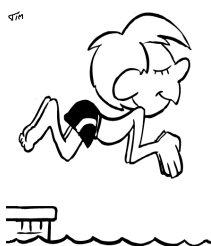
Determiner or article—comes before a noun, e.g. a/an/the.

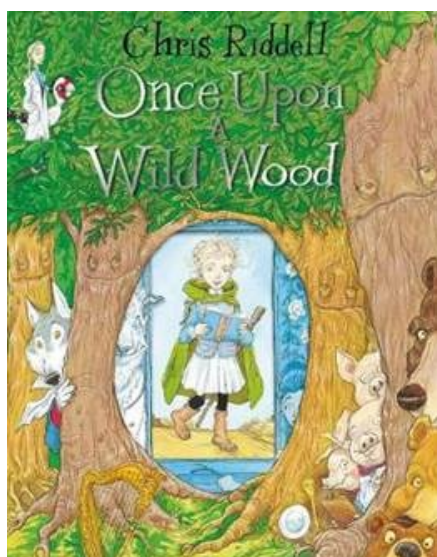
Victorian Day

Recommended Reads

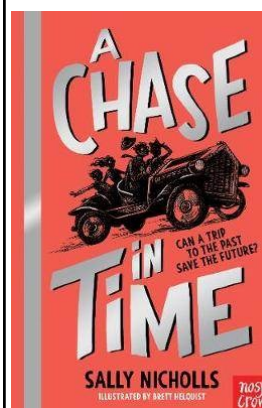


Once upon Wild Wood by Chris Riddell

Alex and Ruby are quickly swept up in a whirl of excitement. They thoroughly enjoy their visit to the past, but will they be able to find their way back to their own time?
