## **Maths and English**


#### Remember:

objectives, and we will also be studying and writing stories with flashbacks. In our guided reading lessons, we will be working on our inference and deduction skills. We will work on our use of a


cursive script in handwriting practice and we will continue to read our class reading book.

## Other subjects

Our geography topic this term is 'Why is Derby such a cool place to live?' Our science topic is 'How different will you be when you are as old as your grandparents?' For this topic, we will be describing the changes as humans develop into old age. In RE, our topic is 'How

can we make our village a more respectful place to live in?' In Citizenship, our theme is 'Bullying Matters'. In PE, we will be improving our cardio-agility and ball chasing skills. In German, we will be learning how to talk

about our local area and our computing topic will be programming, coding and controlling devices. Our art topic will be watercolour landscapes of Etwall and our music topic is 'Reflect, rewind and replay'. We will also be learning the songs for the Y56 production.

Both year groups will be involved in two class swap days, where they will go to their new classes and class-teacher/s. These will happen on Tuesday 2nd and Wednesday 3rd July.

Year 5s will obviously come into school as normal and go to their new classrooms. You will receive further information about this nearer the time.

Year 6s will go to John Port on these days, and spend the days with their new form, and will experience some of the lessons they will take part in next year.

These are two really valuable days, and the children always come back from them full of excitement and enthusiasm for the year ahead! As we find out more information we will pass this on to the children. Class lists normally come out the day before the children go to the class swap days, along with the name of their teacher/form tutor, and for the Year 7s, a map and plan of the day, and the language they will be studying next year.

There will also be other opportunities for the Year 6 children to go across to the school to take part in science lessons, led by sixth form students. We will let you know about these by text, as we find out about them.

As part of our PSHCE curriculum, we will be looking at Relationships and Sex Education (RSE). The children will be taught as separate year groups (Y5 and Y6), and separated into boys and girls, when covering this topic.

When Maia arrives, however, the family is far from welcoming and she is saddened to see that they have blocked out all evidence of the rainforest from their stuffy home.


Maia turns to her strict yet kindly gover-
