# Home learning for English Week commencing 2<sup>nd</sup> Nov

#### **Tuesday-** Retell the story of the gunpowder plot

Read 'the gunpowder story'. Now use the 'Gunpowder Recall' sheet to write sentences to explain what happens.

#### Wednesday- onomatopoeia

Think about the sounds you might hear on Bonfire night and write the words on the 'Onomatopoeia' sheet. Don't forget to use your phonics to help you spell the words.

## **Thursday**

Read the poem 'Crackle! Spit!'. Rewrite the poem but change the onomatopoeia to words that you thought of yesterday.

Challenge: Can you change any of the other verses or even add your own?

### **Friday**

how rhyming works.
Read the poem 'Crackle! Spit!' again and underline the rhyming words. Choose one of the underlined words an write at the top of your page. Write other words that rhyme underneath (this is a rhyming ladder).
