#### **English**

In English this term through our Talk for Writing work we will be exploring persuasive writing.

**Maths and English** 

In our guided reading lessons, we will be working on our inference and deduction skills. Through our English work we will devel-



op our knowledge of spellings, punctuation and grammar (SPAG), and we will work on our use of a cursive script in handwriting practice.

#### Maths

In maths we will work on a range of number and practical problems involving decimals. percentages, multiplication, division algebra and ratio. Although we will be practising our multiplication facts in school, the quicker the children can recall these facts, the easier they will find the whole maths curriculum. Please encourage your child to practise these at home. Thank you.



#### **Other subjects**

Our topic work this term is 'Why are the Norman castles not bouncy?' We will be exploring the Norman invasion and its impact on Britain. Our science topic is 'Do all animals start life as an egg?' and we will be learning about living things & their habitats. In RE, our topic is 'Why is Easter so important for Christians?' In Citizenship, our theme is 'Difference and Diversity'.

In PE, our theme is static balance. In German, we will be learning to talk about our world and the environment.

Our computing topic will be multimedia. In DT, we will be castle building, as part of our humanities topic. In mu-

sic, we will be learning about jazz.




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#### The Super Six guided reading skills

In guided reading lessons across the school, we have introduced the Super Six characters, which are linked to the six skills that we use to comprehend texts. These skills are taken from the National Curriculum objectives for reading. You will see these skills displayed in your child's classroom and your child/children may mention them when discussing texts that they read with you. They are as follows:

#### Five 60 programme

This term, year 5 will take part in the Five 60 programme, which is a PE programme for year 5 pupils, designed to teach them about living a healthy lifestyle. These sessions will be delivered by Premier Sports on a Monday afternoon.





#### **Spelling Shed and Interactive Resources**

Your children should be already familiar with the wonderful resource, Spelling Shed.

Every week, your child's class teacher will set spelling games linked to your child's weekly spelling objectives and children are encouraged to play on these games, to help them to learn their weekly spellings (as this is an important part of their curriculum work).

Every Tuesday, Miss Marriott/Mrs Appleton will look at the weekly spelling scores and a prize will be given to the child who has earned the most points in the last seven days.

#### **Grammar**

Some of the areas we will be looking at this year are:

Relative clauses beginning with who, which, where, when, whose, that, or an omitted relative pronoun (for example: The teacher, who has been teaching for a long time, is looking forward to the new school year).

Indicating degrees of possibility using adverbs [for example, perhaps, surely] or modal verbs [for example, might, should, will, must] adverbials of time [for example, later], place [for example, nearby] and number [for example, secondly].

Use of the semi-colon, colon


and **dash** to mark the boundary between sentences [for example, It's raining; I'm fed up].

The difference between vocabulary typical of **informal speech** and vocabulary appropriate for **formal speech** and writing [for example, find out – discover; ask for – request; go in – enter]. How words are related by meaning as **synonyms** and **antonyms** [for example, big, large, little]. **Brackets, dashes** or **commas** to indicate parenthesis (extra information).

#### By John Boyne

Nine-year-old Bruno knows nothing of the Final Solution and the Holocaust. He is oblivious to the appalling cruelties being inflicted on the people of Europe by his country. All he knows is that he has been moved from a comfortable home in Berlin to a house in a desolate area where there is nothing to do and no one to play with. Until he meets Shmuel, a boy who lives a strange parallel existence on the other side of the adjoining wire fence

and who, like the other people there, wears a uniform of striped pyjamas.

Bruno's friendship with Shmuel will take him from innocence to revelation. And in exploring what he is unwittingly a part of, he will inevitably become subsumed by the terrible process.
