This terms topic:

Why do we love to be beside the seaside?

For the summer term we will be learning about all things seaside! This half term we will be focussing on the geographical features of the seaside that we all know and love! We'll be sharing our experiences of times spent on the coast both in the UK and further afield. We shall be identifying seasonal and daily weather patterns and how these may differ from where we live in the midlands. We'll also be identifying and describing features such as the beach, cliffs, dunes, sea, ocean etc. On top of this we'll also be improving our mapping and direction skills by locating seaside locations and using simple compass directions. Next half term we'll be focussing on the history of the great British seaside and learning all about our love for the traditional summer holiday location!

English and Maths

English

During the half term we will be continuing to improve our writing skills across the curriculum. We will be learning more about the style of non-fiction writing and having a go at creating our own texts. We will be focusing on non-fiction features such as titles, sub-titles, captions, contents pages, labels and glossaries. We'll also be revising our use of spelling, punctuation and grammar to ensure our writing is showcasing all that we are capable of!



Maths

We will be starting off the new half-term by learning all about money. Children will revise each coin's value and practice paying for objects using coins. We will be applying our addition and subtraction skills in order to problem solve using money. Children will also learn how to give change. Any opportunity to use money and handle coins outside of the school setting would benefit pupils greatly!



Science: What plants do we find at the seaside?

This half-term KS1 children will be making the most of our great outdoor area and exploring what trees and plants we have growing in our environment. We'll think about how our environment is different to a seaside location and what trees and plants we may find on the coast. Children will learn to identify and name a variety of common wild and garden plants, including deciduous, ever-

green trees. We will also be learning to identify and describe the basic structure of a variety of common flowering plants/trees including roots, stem leaves, flowers



Computing

We will be using a app called Audacity to improve our computer programming skills. Audacity allows us to record and edit sounds. Children will learn how to open and save files within the app. They will also learn how to alter the sound, speed and pitch of a recording.



Homework

In order to support your child with their learning we encourage parents to hear their child read and write a comment in their Learning Journal. This makes a big difference in the children's ability to understand the meaning of tricky words and decode words that are unfamiliar.



Please remember to write any learning you do with your child in their Learning Journal.

It is also helpful to practice the 2, 5 and 10 times table in order for your child to become fluent and multiplying.

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Art, P.E, PSHE and RE topics:

Art: This half term children will be getting their hands dirty by designing and creating their own collages. We'll be focusing on artist George Seurat to help give us some inspiration!

P.E: During the term the children will be taking part in a variety of activities to improve their coordination and agility skills!

PSHE: The children will be thinking about what it means to be 'Responsible'. We will be discussing what responsibilities each of us have and how we must all be responsible for our own actions.

RE: - In R.E we'll be learning about Christian values. We'll discuss how stories of Jesus teach Christians how to live and how he is a role model to many.
