During this topic we will be adding to our learning about the seaside and seaside towns by looking at the historical aspects of holidays and the seaside. We will be looking at and designing seaside games; learning about what has changed about holidays today and we will be looking at how people travelled to their holiday destinations in the past.

English and Maths

English

During the term we will be writing recounts using first person and the past tense and describing how we feel. We will also be writing a newspaper article about our fun day in school. The children will be focusing on writing for a different audience and performing poems. They will be looking at well known poems and use them to practice performing.



Maths

During the term the children will revisiting the 4 number operations. They will be using arrays to support their learning on multiplication, using sharing techniques to hep them to divide, and they will be using place value to add and subtract bigger numbers. Over the half term the children will also be revisiting shape and time.

Homework

In order to support your child with their learning we encourage parents to hear their child read and write a comment in their Learning Journal. This makes a big difference in the children's ability to understand the meaning of tricky words and decode words that are unfamiliar.



Science: What can we hear at the seaside?

We will be describing different ways of making a sound and investigating what happens when a sound gets closer. The children will be controlling sounds to make them louder and quieter and explore different ways of making sounds. The children will have fun making instruments. Please remember to write any learning you do with your child in their Learning Journal.

It is also helpful to practice the 2, 5 and 10 times table in order for your child to become fluent and multiplying.

Computing

The children will be using the ^{lear} 'Scratch' software to practice programming. The children will be learning how to use the cut and paste tool and layer different things together. They will also be recording sound.

DT, P.E, PSHE and RE topics:

DT: To link in with our topic about the seaside the children will be making puppets using mechanisms, slides and levers. They will be exploring different ways they can make the puppet move.

P.E: The children will continue to follow the new PE scheme where they will

be learning about health and fitness through practicing balance and agility.

PSHE: The children will be talking about bullying. They will be discussing what they think it means and what to do if they think someone is being bullied.

RE: the children will be reading and discussing bible stories. They will be thinking about the meaning within the stores . They

will also be comparing these stories with others,



We are really excited to be inviting parents to a puppet making workshop throughout the term. The children will be creating puppets with the help of the parents that are able to come along.


We really hope you would be able to come and share in your children's learning.
