Welcome back! We hope that you had a lovely break and are rested and ready for the busy term ahead.

English

In English this term through our Talk for Writing work we will be exploring persuasive writing.

Maths and English

In our guided reading lessons, we will be working on our inference and deduction skills. Through our English work we will devel-



op our knowledge of spellings, punctuation and grammar (SPAG), and we will work on our use of a cursive script in handwriting practice.

Maths

In maths we will work on a range of number and practical problems involving decimals. percentages, multiplication, division algebra and ratio. Although we will be practising our multiplication facts in school, the quicker the children can recall these facts, the easier they will find the whole maths curriculum. Please encourage your child to practise these at home. Thank you.



Other subjects

Our topic work this term is 'Why are the Norman castles not bouncy?' We will be exploring the Norman invasion and its impact on Britain. Our science topic is 'Do all animals start life as an egg?' and we will be learning about living things & their habitats. In RE, our topic is 'Why is Easter so important for Christians?' In Citizenship, our theme is 'Difference and Diversity'.

In PE, our theme is static balance. In German, we will be learning to talk about our world and the environment.

Our computing topic will be multimedia. In DT, we will be castle building, as part of our humanities topic. In mu-

sic, we will be learning about jazz.

Please bring the following items with you, clearly named:

Spelling Shed and Interactive Resources

Your children should be already familiar with the wonderful resource, Spelling Shed.

Every week, your child's class teacher will set spelling games linked to your child's weekly spelling objectives and children are encouraged to play on these games, to help them to learn their weekly spellings (as this is an important part of their curriculum work).



Log in names and passwords and the website link (and a QR code) are glued in your child's learning diary. The website is https://play.edshed.co/login

Grammar

Some of the areas we will be looking at this year are:

Relative clauses beginning with who, which, where, when, whose, that, or an omitted relative pronoun (for example: The teacher, who has been teaching for a long time, is looking forward to the new school year).

Indicating degrees of possibility using adverbs [for example, perhaps, surely] or modal verbs [for example, might, should, will, must] adverbials of time [for example, later], place [for example, nearby] and number [for example, secondly].

Use of the semi-colon, colon

and **dash** to mark the boundary between sentences [for example, It's raining; I'm fed up].

The difference between vocabulary typical of **informal speech** and vocabulary appropriate for **formal speech** and writing [for example, find out – discover; ask for – request; go in – enter]. How words are related by meaning as **synonyms** and **antonyms** [for example, big, large, little]. **Brackets, dashes** or **commas** to indicate parenthesis (extra information).


Recommended Reads


Then Mr Darrow, the school caretaker and fellow modeller, goes missing. Max must follow his parting instruction: 'Go to my room. You'll know what to do.'
