Pupil Premium: What is it?

The pupil premium is allocated to schools to enable pupils of low income families to increase their attainment. Funding is allocated to schools to assist pupils who have been registered for free school meals in the last 6 years, this is known as Ever 6. Schools also receive funding for looked after, adopted from care and service children.

Schools are free to spend this funding as is seen fit, however we are required to publish online information regarding its use.
