English

In English this term through our Talk for Writing work we will be exploring science fiction and persuasive writing.

Maths and English

In our guided reading lessons, we will be working on our inference and deduction skills. Through our involving statistics, English work we will develop our knowledge of



spellings, punctuation and grammar (SPAG), and we will work on our use of a cursive script in handwriting practice.

Maths

In maths we will work on a range of number and practical problems measure and percentages.

Although we will be practising our multiplication facts in school, the quicker the children can recall these facts, the easier they will find the whole maths curriculum. Please encourage your child to practise these at home. Thank you.




Other subjects

Our topic work this term is 'What would you have done after school 100 years ago?' We will be learning about leisure and entertainment in the 20th Century. Our science topic is 'Could we ever send another human to the moon?' and we will be learning about Earth and space. In RE, our topic is 'What can be learned from a Buddhist way of life?' In Citizenship, our theme is exploring emotions.

In PE, our theme is dynamic balance. In German, we will be learning to talk about our families and pets.

Our computing topic will be online safety and collaborating and communicating. Our DT topic will be textiles and

we will be making Victorian toys. In music, we will be learning about jazz.

Spelling

Please ensure that your child is practicing their spellings every night. We encourage them to use the look, cover, write, check approach. However, there are lots of other ways you can learn your spellings in order to make it a more enjoyable experience. Some suggestions are:

- writing the word as many times as you can in 1 minute.
- trying to make other words within a word.
- writing the word as a pyramid, e.g.

If your child is struggling to spell a word correctly, ask them to write it out in three different ways and decide which one looks right.

Grammar

Some of the areas we will be looking at this year are:

Relative clauses beginning with who, which, where, when, whose, that, or an omitted relative pronoun (for example: The teacher, who has been teaching for a long time, is looking forward to the new school year).

Indicating degrees of possibility using adverbs [for example, perhaps, surely] or modal verbs [for example, might, should, will, must] adverbials of time [for example, later], place [for example, nearby] and number [for example, secondly].

Use of the semi-colon, colon

and **dash** to mark the boundary between sentences [for example, It's raining; I'm fed up].

The difference between vocabulary typical of **informal speech** and vocabulary appropriate for **formal speech** and writing [for example, find out – discover; ask for – request; go in – enter]. How words are related by meaning as **synonyms** and **antonyms** [for example, big, large, little]. **Brackets, dashes** or **commas** to indicate parenthesis (extra information).

A companion novel to bestselling story of orphan Jim Jarvis set in Victorian England.


