
ST JOHNS AMBULANCE TRAINING FOR KS2 BI-ANNUAL TRAINING

SAFEGUARD UPDATE: ONLINE SAFETY WEEK.

During Online Safety week just before half term, each class engaged in a



wide range of Online Safety activities, including a workshop led by an e-Safety advisor, Traci Good. Many classes focused on what information is appropriate to share online, including selfies. We also recapped what we must do if we have any concerns

about things that we see/experience online. We also held our second parent (and teacher) Online Safety training workshop during this week, focussing particularly on the different apps that young children are using today and how to keep our children safe when online. Thank you to the parents/carers who took the time to come to the workshop and learn more about this important



safeguarding issue. We will continue to educate the children in school about Online Safety issues throughout the school year.

REVIEW OF E-SCHOOLS LEARNING PLATFORM AND ONLINE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

The school is currently reviewing its use of the e-schools learning platform. Pupils log in to this via the school web site. It has been used more extensively in KS2 for introducing blogs, class discussions and links to useful web sites to support your child's learning. - not share their passwords
- have secure passwords (ie not their name)
- not NEVER save their password on the PC/tablet/smart phone

• ensure that their use of technology is closely monitored by parents at all times.

In light of this, it was very disappointing that parents did not engage in our Online Safety workshop – the 2nd this year. Many online issues were discussed including:

- inappropriate content of various apps and web sites
- online grooming
- Lack of online safety features on sites children are known to use
- sharing inappropriate images
- safe passwords
- children's use of social media at inappropriate ages
- need for parents to closely monitor their child's online activity.

Your child will probably know far more than you about what they can do online so we need to ensure that they are safe by being more aware.

Our Digital Leaders are going to produce a guide about the safe use of passwords to be sent home to all parents and put on the school web site. **Online Safety is a huge safeguarding issue for all children and one that we cannot tackle alone – we need all parents to engage with us to keep your children safe.** Please look at the advice on NSPCC Online safety – share aware that we have previously detailed in newsletters. We believe we should strive to recognise and praise good behaviour / good choices as it occurs, reward children for behaving well, explain and demonstrate the behaviour we would like to see, ensure that criticism is constructive and encourage children to be responsible for their own behaviour and make good choices. Many of the rewards are linked to our "starfish" values:

Sportsmanship Truthfulness Aspiration Respect Friendship Independence Sharing Helpfulness











HOMEWORK SHOWCASES

Following consultation with staff, pupils and parents, we changed our approach to homework in order to focus on the essentials: reading daily, learning spelling rules / phonics, Rapid Number Recall that focuses on mental maths and lastly learning our multiplication and division facts so all children can more easily apply these to their everyday maths work. If you are unsure of any aspect of this, then please speak to class teachers. The topic based voluntary homework projects were well received by the children and we saw the fruits of their labours in the KS1 and KS2 Homework Showcases. They were brilliant! Thank you to parents for engaging your child so well in this.

In KS1 we held our first ever 'Homework Showcase' to show off all of the amazing work children (and parents!) have been completing at home! Our topic was 'Inspirational People' and

of the effort children have been putting into their homework projects. <u>SPORTS UPDATE:</u> SPORTSHALL ATHLETICS

Members of Y5/6 represented our school at Greenbank Leisure Centre in Swadlincote, at an athletics competition. We are pleased to say that out of 12 schools we managed to win 3rd place! The children did an excellent job of competing in the events, particular highlights being Lewis' 1st place in the long jump, with an incredible jump of 1.88m, and

Olivia, Trinity, Bella and Eleanor taking 1st place in 4 x 1 relay. The children tried their hardest in all track and field events that they competed in, and they did us proud. Well done to all of the children (Trinity, Bella, Olivia, Olivia, Erin-Rose, Eleanor, Lewis, Tom, Joseph, Zak, Finlay, Denholm) and congratulations on winning bronze!

LOCAL FOOTBALL FINAL AT MORR FARM TRAINING GROUND – 27TH JANUARY 2017

Having got through to the Local Final, we were invited to Moor Farm Training ground to participate in the Local Final. Six teams had made it through after competing at DW Sports the week earlier. Etwall played St Johns in the first game which we drew 2 - 2. The second game was much the same, drawing 0 - 0. We desperately needed 3 points to still be in with a chance as the bottom two teams

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were to go home, leaving only the top four to fight it out. Fortunately, we won the third game against Melbourne, giving us 3 points. We then went on to lose the game against Mickleover Primary School 1-0, who had one every game so far. The final game was against Gayton which we drew 1-1.

Fortunately, this was enough to get us through! This left us third in the table with Mickleover Primary finishing first, Gayton second and St Johns fourth. This meant we played Gayton in the semi-final. It was tense stuff as after 0 - 0; it went to extra time. A fantastic header from Jack in the last few minutes saw us through to the final. Surprisingly Mickleover Primary were out after St Johns took them to penalties. In the final, we showed what a fantastic team we were. Conor scoring two goals and Jack one. Ending the final at a 3-0 win. WELL DONE LADS!



This now means that Etwall have finished first out of a total of 62 teams. What an achievement! We now go on to represent Derby County in the regional finals at Barnsley during March. *If we win this, then we will be playing at Wembly in the national finals.* Wow! Watch this space!
