Maths and English



English

In English this term we will of number and practical be learning to write information texts and reports. In our guided reading lessons, we will be working on our inference and deduction skills. Through our will be practicing our English work we will further develop our

knowledge of spellings, punctuation and grammar (SPAG).

Maths

In maths this term we will be solving a range problems involving multiplication and division as well as different methods of measuring. Although we multiplication facts in school, the quicker the

children can recall these facts, the easier they will find the whole maths curriculum. Please encourage your child to practice these at home. Thank you.



Other subjects

Our topic work this term will look closely at what we would have done with our ago. Science is 'What is above us in the sky?'. This involves studying the movement of the sun and how this affects us,

and also how this affects night and day. Our RE will consider the life of Buddha. In PSHCE leisure time 100 years our theme is 'Exploring Emotions'. In PE we will be developing our Balance and coordination skills. In German we will learn the names of family members, while

talking about our homes. Computing will explore internet safety and how we communicate online and in Art we will be making a toy. In music we will continue to develop rhythm and musical notation skills through voice and instrumental work.

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
Rapid Number Recall

Rapid number recall is based on the belief that if children have rapid recall of key facts in maths, they will find all other areas of the maths curriculum much easier. For example, when being asked to find out the fraction of an amount, if they have good understanding of their multiplication facts, they will find this much easier.

The program is based on a series of steps, and within each step there are several objectives. Your child's teacher will initially tell your child where they will start and then they will work through the steps in order.

You will find the step that your child is working on, and the target within that step, in their reading journal, along with ideas about how you can help them to achieve this target. Children will also have time to practice these in school, but obviously the more help they get the quicker they will achieve!

Each target has a 24 question quiz that children will be asked to complete daily. When they can get 100% three times, children will move on to the next target. The progress your child is making will be recorded in their reading diaries so that you can share their successes with them.


