What are the differences between a planet and a star?	1	
Galileo Galilei, a famous scientist, built his first telescope in 1609 to study the Moon. What did he discover about our Solar System?	2	
Over the next 28 days, keep a moon journal. Each day, go outside and draw what the moon looks like. What are the different phases of the Moon called? Label these on your drawings.	2

Produce a fact- file on one aspect of German life such as: celebrations, school life, home life, an area of your choice etc.	2	
Draw and label members of your family using German words for brother, sister etc.	2	
Produce a poster which will teach children the German numbers up to 30.	2

Queen Victoria is the longest reigning monarch in UK history. Write a biography of Queen Victoria.	5	
Compare the life of a rich child with a poor child. Split your page in half and write down the differences.	1	
Pick one of your favourite books and write a book review to encourage other children to read it.	2	
<u>Maths</u>		
Calculate, using your age, the answers to the following questions. How many times have you travelled around the Sun? How many times have you rotated with the Earth?	2	
Choose a country and research the temperature over a week. Plot your results on a line graph. Remember to add a title and label your axis.	2
