
Learning Journals

Please remember to fill out your child's Learning Journal with all the wonderful things your child has been learning at home.

English and Maths

English - We will continue to follow 'Letters and Sounds' and Jolly Phonics to ensure your child is able to use phonic sounds to support reading and spelling. Please see the homework booklet for this weeks sound.

During this term we will be studying traditional tales such as Little Red Riding Hood. We will also be looking at Christmas poetry at the end of the year.





Maths- Throughout this term the children will be learning how to create and interpret data. They will be learning how to read scales and answering measurement problems as well as practically measuring objects. We will also be learning how to calculate multiplication and division through use of practical and mental calculation methods.

Homework

In order to support your child with their learning we encourage parents to hear their child read and write a comment in their Learning Journal. This makes a big difference in the children's ability to understand the meaning of tricky words and decode words that are unfamiliar.

Remember Bug club is a great way to get your child reading and also has interactive questions to help with comprehension.



Science: What material is an air raid shelter made from?

During the term we will be thinking about different materials and comparing their properties. We will be thinking about why materials are using to make certain objects and we will be linking this to our topic of WWI by looking at the ma-



terials air raid shelters were made from and why.

It is also helpful to practice the 2,5 and 10 times table in order for your child to become fluent at multiplying. We are always telling the children how much everything comes back to knowing their times tables, so anything you can do to consolidate this will be greatly appreciated.

Computing

From now until the Christmas holidays, we will be showing the children different ways of recording information, for example by using sound, photographs, pictures or text. This continues our commitment to improving their ICT skills, something we consider vital in this day and age.

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DT, P.E, PSHE and RE topics:



DT: this half term we will be focusing on creating structures using a variety of joins and materials to make our own air raid shelters.

P.E: The children will be enjoying a unit in which they will learn how to dynamically balance.



PSHE: The children will be exploring their emotions and understand how behavior can effect others.

Remember to check your child's reading diary to keep a record of what step they are on. Keep practicing at home to help them move to the next level!



Common Exception Words

Exception words are words in which the English spelling code works in an unusual or uncommon way. They are not words for which phonics 'doesn't work', but they may be exceptions to spelling rules, or words which use a particular combination of letters to represent sound patterns in a rare or unique way.

Some exception words are used very frequently, which is why children are introduced to them very early on in their phonics learning (in Reception, alongside high frequency words, and in Key Stage 1).

During the year we will be supporting your children with these common exception words. It would really help your child to support this learning at home through quick but regular practise of these words.

Christmas Craft Showcase


