Maths and English

Remember:

In our guided reading lessons, we will continue to develop our understanding of texts and our inference and deduction skills. Through our English work we will also be developing our knowledge of spellings, punctuation and grammar (spag).

<u>Maths</u>

In maths this term ,we will be continuing our work on geometry and we will also be learning about decimals and percentages. In addition to this, we will be further developing our knowledge of fractions.



We will continue to work on formal methods for addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.

Although we will be practising our multiplication facts in school, the quicker the children can recall these facts, the easier they will find the whole maths curriculum. Please encourage your child to practise these.

Other subjects

Our **humanities** topic this term will be 'What is so special about the USA?' As part of our work on this topic, we will be studying geographical similarities and differences through the study of human and physical geography of North America.

In **science** our topic is Earth and Space, and we will be learning all about the Solar System.

In **PE** our themes are trigolf and athletics. In **RE** our topic is 'What can we learn from the Hindu way of life?' In **PSHCE** our theme is 'Going for Goals' and in **computing** we are learning about algorithms through the program 'Scratch'. In **German** our theme is food and drink and in art we are learning about textiles and using felt.



Online Safety Week 6th—10th February 2017

We cannot stress enough the importance of keeping your child safe online. Within the school, we teach online safety throughout the year but have a designated week to raise children's awareness.

During this week, the children will be taking part in various activities and discussions as well as having an Online Safety Workshop led by Traci Goode. We will also be offering parents another chance to attend an Online Safety Workshop on Thursday 9th February at 3.45pm. The course will also be led by Traci Goode who is an e-safety advisor.

Your child will be able to attend After School Club free of charge whilst you attend the meeting. A letter will be sent out closer to the time.



Useful English vocabulary

Children in years 5 and 6 are expected to have a good understanding of the different words classes in the English language. To help your child to develop their knowledge of this, the following vocabulary may be useful:

Preposition—describes the position of something, e.g. on/under.

British Values

n—a connecting

Conjunction—a connecting word such as and, because, so, consequently.

Determiner or article—comes before a noun, e.g. a/an/the.

Relative Clause— Extra detail in a sentence beginning with words such as *who*, *which*, *where*, *when*. **Synonym**— words with similar meanings such as cold, icy, wintry.

Homophone— words sounding the same but spelt differently and have different meaning such as here, hear.

Pronouns—replace the nouns such as they, we, he, them, us, this, it.

Noun Phrase— adds information to the noun such as, The fox with the bushy tail.

It is a statutory requirement of schools to promote British values. So what are British values? According to Ofsted, Fundamental British values are: democracy; the rule of law; individual liberty; mutual respect for and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs and for those without faith. However, long before the government asked all British schools to teach fundamental British values, Etwall Pri-School have mary been promoting these values through our own values, curriculum and enrichment. Examples of this include: school council, digital leaders, ecocouncil, assemblies, high expectations of behaviour, citizenship, R-time, circle time, anti-bullying work, Online Safety work, pupil of the week, citizen of the week,

mini leaders, lunch time helpers, marking and celebrating key religious festivals and opportunities to visit places of worship. We will continue to keep you updated on our work and endeavour to develop our children into responsible and respectful individuals.

They will have access to adult support, books, IPads and computers to help them consolidate and do further research on work covered in class.
