Maths and English

Remember:

- * Children will have mental maths and writing targets glued into their learning diaries. Times table are also expected to be practiced every week.

English

In English this term we will be doing lots of grammar and spelling lessons and we will also be developing our recount writing skills, using Talk for Writing to help us. We will be looking at the book, 'The Promise', which will help us debate issues and di-



Other subjects

Our topic work this term is the First World War. Our science topic is 'How does Jessica Ennis-Hill run so fast?'. For this topic, we will be looking at nutrition and the Musculoskeletal system. In RE, our topic is 'Can religions build a fair world?' In Citizenship, our reading lessons, we will be working on our inference and deduction skills, and will begin to generate our own questions, to check our understanding. We will work on our use of a cursive script in handwriting practice.

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Maths

In maths, we will be learning about place value as well as addition and subtraction.

Although we will be practising our multiplication facts in school, the quicker the children can recall these facts, the easier they will find the whole maths curriculum. Please encourage your child to practise these at home so they can can enjoy our weekly times table tester on a Monday, too. Thank you.

In PE we will be doing Cardio – coordination and learning how to cool – down after an activity.

In German we will learn greetings, classroom vocabulary and commands, and our computing topic will be refreshing basic skills.

In Key Stage 2, children must really try hard to learn their times tables, as this will help in their everyday maths lessons. We do a times tables tester on a Monday morning, which is a fun way to check our progress and encourages children to be quick with their recall.

Rapid number recall is another way we keep children fluent with number facts, and they should be practicing maths which relates to their particular step at home. This information will be relayed to you through your child's learning diary.



We expect children to read at least 5 times a week. Please record this in your child's journal so that we are able to see the extent to which they are engaging with reading. Reading has a huge bearing on a child's grasp of grammar and improves their vocabulary infinitely.
