Useful English vocabulary

Children in years 5 are expected to have a sound knowledge of the different words classes in the English language. To help your child to develop their knowledge of this, the following vocabulary may be useful:

Common nouns—names of objects or things in general, e.g.

dog, school.

Proper nouns—names of people or places, e.g. Etwall, Harry.

Verbs-doing words.

Adjectives—describing words.

Pronouns—replace a noun, e.g. him/her /it.

Adverbs—describe a verb or an

adjective, e.g. slowly, lazily.

Preposition—describes the position of something, e.g. on/under.

Conjunction—a connecting word such as and, because, so, consequently.

Determiner or article—comes before a noun, e.g. a/an/the.

As part of our work on British Values and international understanding, year 5 children will be writing to our partner school in Germany.

Anthony Horowitz, creator of star teenage spy Alex Rider, launches a phenomenal, action-packed adventure series with Stormbreaker.
