Frau Mellor will be teaching the children German on Wednesday mornings. She will endeavor to cover some of the following objectives. They will be:

- * listening for specific words and sounds.
- * identifying phonemes which are the same as or different from

English.

- * repeating words and phrases. speaking clearly.
- * saying please and thank you. introducing themselves.
- * asking someone what their name is.
- * understanding classroom in-

structions.

- * knowing some things about the everyday life of children of different cultures and countries.
- * comparing my everyday life with that of a different culture or country.

E-Safety

Derbyshire County Council and Derbyshire Police are increasingly receiving reports of children and young people accessing inappropriate content and being contacted by unknown individuals using apps and websites which enable video chat. There has also recently been national research published by the Internet Watch Foundation which identified that children and young people as young as seven were being ex-

ploited online on webcams and chat sites. This local and national concern serves as an opportunity for us to remind all children and young people about being safe online and work together in partnership with parents/carers.

Here at Etwall we continue to teach our pupils all about how to stay safe on the internet although we believe by reinforcing this at home the message becomes much clearer. For support at home about e-safety check out these websites:

PSHE, P.E, Music, ADT, Computing and R-Time

In PHSE, the children will be

thinking about the value of money and how to look it, as well as learning about how they are growing and changing.

In P.E, the children are going to be taking part in outdoor adventurous activities, for example, den building, orienteering and obstacle courses.

In music, we are listening to and recalling sounds with increasing aural memory.

In ADT, the children are going to be making a working draw bridge and a Norman castle. In computing, the children will be developing their programming skills by using Kodu.

R-Time will continue every Thursday, allowing the children dedicated time to reflect on the qualities of good citizenship.

Humanities and R.E

In humanities, our topic question is 'Why were the Norman castles certainly not bouncy?'

They will be looking at castles, William the Conqueror, the Norman conquest and why 1066 is an important date.

In RE, the title of this term's

topic is 'Can religions build a fair world?'

The children will be thinking about what fairness and justice is, what we can learn from religious teachings about how to treat others, why we should treat people fairly, what is Fair Trade and why is it important.
