Extra-Curricular Activities



As you are no doubt aware, we strive to provide the children in our care with a wide variety of extra-curricular offerings to grow them as people not just within, but outside of the classroom. As such, here are some details of the offerings we will be providing throughout this academic year:

Wrap Around Care

Through Active Bodies, we offer wrap around care 5 days a week from 7:30am – 9:00am and 3:30pm – 6:00pm.

Sporting Opportunities



Lunchtime Sports Clubs — a wide variety of <u>free</u> sessions to cover EYFS, KS1 and KS2 with a different sporting focus for each term. Last year, sessions covered dodgeball, multi-sports, orienteering, cricket, boccia, tennis, dodgeball, mini hockey, orienteering and cricket. This will be run by Progressive Sports

This Girl Can - Free, half hour sessions for KS1 and KS2 focussing on developing sporting skills and increasing uptake of competitive sports for girls. This will be run by Progressive Sports.

Gymnastics - Monday afternoons – two, hour-long sessions (KS1 3:30pm – 4:30pm and KS2 4:30pm – 5:30pm) working on gymnastic ability and towards the British Gymnastics Proficiency Awards. This will be run by Active Bodies.

Soccerstars – Tuesday 3:30pm – 4:30pm for KS1 and Thursday 3:30pm – 4:30pm for KS2 – Football based skills based drills and small sided games. This will be run by Soccerstars.

Various Sporting Clubs - Wednesday 3:30pm – 4:30pm – an hour-long session for KS1 and KS2, focussing on a different sport each term throughout the year. Last year, sessions covered dance, sports hall athletics, orienteering, multi-sports, cricket and tennis and this year will be much the same. This will be run by Progressive Sports.

Karate – Friday 3:30pm – 4:30pm – We will be continuing with the popular karate club, which has been running for a number of years. It will initially be offered to KS2 children, with the possibility of a KS1 offering dependent on numbers. This will be run by UK Karate Jutsu.

Non-Sporting Opportunities

Yoga – Tuesday lunchtimes – two, half hour sessions for KS1 and KS2 children focussing on relaxation techniques and the principles and practices of yoga for all pupils. This will be run by Yogic Frog.

French –Tuesday 3:30pm – 4:05pm (KS1) and Wednesday 3:30pm – 4:05pm (Y3/4) – We will be continuing our well-received French language offering as we have done in previous years. This will be run by La Jolie Ronde.

Imagineering – Monday 3:30pm – 4:30pm – Our after school club with a focus on engineering will be continuing, giving Y5/6 children the opportunity to build models and explore what it takes to become an engineer. TBC

Code Club – Tuesday 3:30pm - 4:30pm – Code club, looking at programming language and the skills needed to become a computer programmer. This club will be open to Y3/4 children. TBC

Lego Club – Tuesday lunchtimes (KS1) and Friday lunchtimes (KS2) – Mrs Robinson will be giving the opportunity to make new friends and build lego models for <u>free</u> at the same time, throughout the year.

As you can see, we have tried to provide a balance of activities to interest as many children as possible throughout the year. Please take the time to discuss the contents of this letter with your child and keep your eyes peeled for further information on all of the above, as letters will be sent out in due course.

Class Newsletters and Homework Booklets

The new booklets have gone out this week and can also be found on the class pages on the school website along with the new class newsletters. We hope this clarifies our expectations for homework and also includes the popular homework task that some children and families choose to do in addition to our set homework. Please speak to your child's class teacher should there be any further information of guidance needed. Thank you for your continued support.

Guidance on Leave of Absence



The Department for Education expects schools and local authorities to promote good attendance and reduce absences, including persistent absence. This is because we know that missing out on lessons leaves children vulnerable to falling behind. Children with poor attendance tend to achieve less in both primary and secondary schools. It is also important to remember that by taking your child out of school during term time you may

be giving them an unspoken message that school is not important.

In September 2013 the Education (Pupil Registration) (England) (Amendment) Regulations 2013 came into force. These regulations made it clear that Headteachers should not grant approval for any leave of absence during term time including holidays, unless there was exceptional circumstances. These regulations also state that holidays cannot be authorised retrospectively. Any requests should be on the official school leave of absence request form and handed in to the school office *prior to any holiday or leave arrangements being made.*

Parents and carers may be issued with a Penalty Notice should any leave be taken which is not authorised. If unpaid this could lead to prosecution under section 444(1) of the Education Act 1996.

On 6 April 2017 the Supreme Court appeal, in relation to the Platt v Isle of Wight case, determined that under section 444(1) of the Education Act 1996 attending school 'regularly' means:

"in accordance with the rules prescribed by the school"

From 1 September 2017 the local authority will consider the issue of a penalty notice for any period of holiday absence which has not been authorised by the headteacher *regardless of a child's wider school attendance*.

Please see the Headteacher to discuss any requests for leave well in advance of the dates requested and ensure that all information is provided with any application as lack of information can cause delays in the Headteacher responding once the form is received. Thank you for you continued cooperation.

Attendance and Lateness Monitoring



School starts at 8.55am. If your child arrives at school after this time, they will need to be signed in at the school office, so come straight to the main entrance. Your child will then be registered as late to school. If your child is unaccompanied, then the school office will text you to let you know your child was late as you may have sent them off on time! A reason is requested

and recorded. Lateness is monitored closely and meetings arranged to discuss continued lateness as required.

The Headteacher monitors attendance at least half termly. Good attendance is 96% and above. If your child's attendance becomes cause for concern then you will be notified via text or letter, sometimes requesting that you make an appointment to see the Headteacher. Please do so on receipt of the text or letter. We will work with you to improve your child's attendance and keep informed of any medical issues affecting their attendance. Appointments should be arranged out of school hours wherever possible please. If your child is ill, please inform the school office by 9.30am and send a note to the class teacher on their return – this saves the school office having to chase this up. Thank you for your continued support.

Letters Reminder



We have been very pleased with the year on year increase in parents and carers who have opted for email communication. This saves the school a huge photocopying bill, but we are having to reduce this even further. To this end, we are no longer providing paper copies in the majority of cases.

If letters are emailed with a slip to return (for example an after school club or school trip), we ask that you either print out the slip, provide the info requested on a piece of paper and return to your child's class teacher in the normal way, or email to enquiries@etwall.derbyshire.sch.uk

<u>Is Your Child Entited To Pupil Premium Funding?</u>



As you may be aware, the issue of education funding has been in the news a lot recently, with schools facing reduced budgets alongside increased costs. At Etwall we are no different and a number of difficult decisions have had to be made regarding expenditure for 2018-19. The situation is not expected to improve in the foreseeable future, as the government seeks to reduce costs still

further.

One way that schools such as ours look to support pupils learning is through Pupil Premium funding, which allowed us to provide additional support to pupils in a variety of ways throughout 2017-18, for example enrichment activities, in class support through Teaching Assistants, funding for inclusion and targeted interventions for pupils with additional needs. The bulk of our funding goes to provide specific support for Pupil Premium children through teaching assistants and dedicated intervention staff and, as such, is a key source of funding for the school.

People often see the Pupil Premium as 'Free School Meals' when, as we have shown, the reality is much more than that. By signing up for Pupil Premium funding, you will have a direct impact on improving the education of both your child and those across the school for the next <u>6 years</u>.

Your child will receive:

- Additional support in the form of a Teaching Assistant in morning lessons on a daily basis
- Targeted support in one-to-one or small group sessions for your child, whatever their academic ability, provided by a dedicated Pupil Premium teacher
- Specific 'pre-learning' sessions from class teachers as appropriate
- Fully funded enrichment day visits
- Discounted wrap around care (breakfast and after school club)
- Fully funded extra-curricular activities such as sports, Imagineering and language clubs
- Fully funded music lessons should they wish to learn how to play a musical instrument
- Subsidies for residential visits
- Provision of free books relating to the interests of each child
- Contributions towards school uniform costs
- Free milk
- Free nutritious school meals on a daily basis

You are eligible for Pupil Premium funding if: you receive income support; income-based jobseekers' allowance; income-related employment and support allowance; support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999; the guaranteed element of state pension credit; child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less; universal credit

You are also eligible if your child is defined in the Children Act 1989 as: one who is in the care of, or provided with accommodation by, an English local authority; children who have ceased to be looked after by a local authority in England and Wales because of adoption, a special guardianship order, a child arrangements order or a residence order; or has a parent who is in the armed forces

If you think you may be eligible for Pupil Premium funding, please contact the school office. We will happily discuss this with you and even fill the forms in on your behalf.

Learning Diaries




Please look out for your child's new learning diary, which will replace the reading records we have used in previous years. It will be sent home with your child this week and is to be used as a learning and communication book between the parents, children and teachers, to be used in the following ways: to record reading done at home and in school by school staff and parents/family members (please note that

as per homework policy we ask that children record reading in their diary at least 5 times a week); to record comments about any learning done at home, e.g. times table practise, phonics practise, spellings practise; to record children's logon IDs for Bug Club, Interactive Resources, Purple Mash etc. (as appropriate to year group); and to glue in children's current writing targets, Rapid Number Recall targets etc.

The purpose of the learning diary is to allow for a dialogue between home and school related to children's learning, in a supportive and positive way for the children. Please note that any concerns or comments you may have about anything other than your child's learning need to continue to be addressed in person or by telephone to your child's class teacher, rather than written in the book.

We hope that you will find the learning diary to be a much improved version of the reading diaries that we used to use, and a supportive record of your child's home/school learning relationship.

Swimming Pool



We cannot thank you enough for bearing with us whilst the issues regarding the school pool are being resolved. We are now entering the final phase of the project – the vast majority of which is being funded by Derbyshire County Council – which will provide us with a pool which is fit for purpose and one that we can all be proud of.
