Welcome back! We hope you had a lovely half term break and are rested and ready for the remainder of the Spring term.

Maths and English

Remember:

- PE kits need to be in school every day.
- Reading journals will be checked every Friday (Eagles) and Monday (Ospreys).
- Spelling test is every
 Friday. Please support
 your child in learning
 their spellings.
- * Children will have writing targets glued into their reading journals. Times tables and spellings are also expected to be practised every week.

English

In English this term, we will be studying a Talk for Writing unit on persuasive writing. We will also be deepening our knowledge of spellings, punctuation and grammar (SPAG), and we will work on our use of a cursive script in handwriting practice. In our guided reading lessons, we will be working on our inference and deduction skills and we will continue to read our class reading

book, Noah Barleywater Runs Away (by John Boyne).

Maths

In maths we will be learning about measurement and algebra and solving problems using reasoning skills. We will also continue to practise our calculation skills using all four operations in our daily lessons and weekly arith-

metic work.

Although we will be practising our multiplication facts in school, the quicker the children can recall these facts, the easier they will find the whole maths curriculum. Please encourage your child to practise these at home. Thank you.

Other subjects




Our humanities work this term is 'Why are the Norman Castles not Bouncy?'
We will be exploring the Norman Invasion and its impact on Britain. Our science topic is 'Do All Animals Start Life as an Egg?' and we will be learning about the life cycle of mammals, amphibians, insects and birds. In RE,

our topic is 'Why is Easter so Important for Christians?' In Citizenship, our theme is 'Difference and Diversity'.

In PE, our theme is balance and agility and we will be developing these skills through ball games. In German, we will be learning to talk about our world and the environment.

Our computing topic will be multimedia. In DT, we will be castle building, as part of our humanities topic. In music, we will be studying a topic called 'I'll be There'.



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Spelling Shed and Interactive Resources

Your children should be already familiar with the wonderful resource, Spelling Shed.



Every week, we will set spelling games linked to your child's weekly spelling objectives and children are encouraged to play on these games, to help them to learn their weekly spellings (as this is an important part of their curriculum work).

Reading journals



Reading is of vital importance to children's development as

learners across the curriculum, as becoming a fluent reader with sound comprehension skills is the key to learning across a range of subjects throughout a child's education.

Reading for pleasure is invaluable

in helping children to develop their stamina as a reader and to develop the skills they need to deepen their understanding of texts, and to meet with end of Key Stage 2 expectations.

Your child's reading journal is an important part of their development as readers, and children are encouraged to record at least 5 entries a week in their reading journals. This can be simply recording the pages of

their book/a newspaper/comic that they have read, or engaging with the suggested activities that are glued into the front and back of their reading journals. We encourage them to do a combination of these things each week.

Please could you encourage your child to use their reading journals appropriately, to support them in their development as a reader.

Year 6 Assessments


We have recently sent home revision guides with year 6 pupils to help them to prepare for their assessments in May (w.b. 13th May). These include revision guides for maths, English, spelling and grammar. The idea of the revision guides is for the children to work through them at their own pace, focusing on the areas that they know they need to practise.

The revision guides are there to support the children in areas they feel they need to work on, but they are by no means meant to put pressure on the children or make them feel that they have to revise every night!
